Au Arias

Au Arias is a Scotland-based music director and composer. Originally born in Argentina, Au Arias has developed an international career in more than five countries (Turkey, South Africa, UK, Mexico, Brazil and Argentina) either from the orchestra podium or by showcasing his compositions in festivals and concerts.

As Musical Director, he has had a wide experience of conducting opera, orchestras and choirs. He made his professional debut in 2014 by premiering his own opera "Gruta de Ninfas" in Argentina with great success. Among other appointments, highlights include his positions as opera director at the Izmir State Opera and the Samsun State Opera (Republic of Turkey) where he conducted more than 70 professional productions.

As Composer, he gained recognition for his choral-orchestral works such as Tango Mass and his opera Gruta de Ninfas. His music has been described as "neo-impressionist". However, his interests are wider than this, because of his exploration of electro-acoustic resources and other elements of the music of today. Melody, consonance, texture and noise can be found in his works. For Au Arias, Music is not just music, but a way to paint the world we live in.

Au Arias is currently based in Glasgow - where he leads two choirs (InChorus and The Mackintosh Choir). He delivers piano and music tuition at his own studio. He is also a mountain-bike enthusiast who likes going for long rides in the countryside.

Gordon Cree

Gordon Cree was born in Ayrshire and was classically trained in piano and singing at the Royal Scottish Academy of Music & Drama. In a career that now spans more than two decades, he has achieved a formidable reputation as an entertainer, musician, after-dinner speaker, compere, occasional actor, arranger, orchestrator and occasional conductor for orchestras throughout the world.

As a solo artiste he has appeared in concert, cabaret, pantomime and summer season throughout the world, including three seasons at the Nevele Grande Stardust Room (New York), two summer seasons at the Blackpool Winter Gardens; countless appearances in The Good Old Days at Leeds' world-famous City Varieties Music Hall. He is also a popular regular "Star Guest Performer" aboard the world's luxury cruise liners.

In 1990 he was awarded the "Scottish Young Organist of the Year" title; in 1997 he won the Sir Hugh S. Roberton Prize for Scots Song; in 2008 he was made a Freeman of the City of Glasgow; in 2009 he was admitted to the British Ring of the International Brotherhood of Magicians; in 2012 he was elected a Fellow of the Guild of Musicians and Singers; and in April 2019 he received the Lifetime Achievement Award from the Scottish Music Hall and Variety Theatre Society — an accolade which has been awarded to several legends of Scottish entertainment, including Jack Milroy, Johnny Beattie and Jimmy Logan.

The Mackintosh Choir – a little bit of history

The award-winning Mackintosh Choir is an open access, non-audition community choir based here in Kelvindale.

The choir was established by a small enthusiastic group in October 2011 with support from the Charles Rennie Mackintosh Society and Queen's Cross Housing Association.

Our first public performance was at Christmas 2011, in the beautiful surroundings of the Charles Rennie Mackintosh Church in the Queen's Cross area of Glasgow. For the first few years the Mackintosh Church was the venue for our rehearsals, concerts, singing workshops and other musical events, bringing to the area an excellent opportunity to engage with the arts. In 2016, due to the growing size of the choir and the physical constraints of the Mackintosh Church as a performance venue, we moved here to the much larger St John's-Renfield Church.

In 2015 the choir was highly honoured to be conducted by the world-renowned composer, John Rutter CBE, as we sang his arrangement of "Feel the Spirit" at our summer concert. We were even more honoured when he agreed to be the choir's Patron.

As well as our own concerts, the choir has joined other Glasgow Choirs for a variety of performances in the Glasgow City Halls, the Glasgow Royal Concert Hall, and the Bandstands in Kelvingrove Park and Queen's Park.

In 2017, we gave musical support to the National Theatre of Scotland's production of 'The Submarine Time Machine' in a week of outdoor performances along the towpath of the Forth and Clyde Canal. In June this year we had the opportunity to sing with the Delaware Women's Chorus, Wilmington.


